

Key Stage 2 Numeracy resource: Live below the line

<p>This Think Global resource explores food waste and poverty primarily through numeracy activities, although it is also an opportunity for cross-curricular work in geography, PSE or science. Development You could:

- Develop the work into a whole-school project such as [Food for Life](#).
- Ask pupils to design an event for the 2017 World Food Day to raise awareness of the issues of food waste and poverty.
